I thank God that through helping the community as a volunteer in World Vision Kenya (WVK), I have interacted with many souls - the lost and the great stewards of the gospel. Moreover I see a real door to evangelise and share the experience. It has helped me to understand how the communities live and their social status.

I have been teaching the community the need to preserve the environment and use the unique methodology of (FMNR) farmer managed natural regeneration and get the true knowledge of mitigation system and I am sure that is what God has planned for us to do. When I teach them the essential part of caring the environment, I teach them the importance of coming back to Christ, the realization of sin and the concept of understanding the need to do so.

We have made some family visitations and we hope that will turn positive to all the families that we have made the visitation.

Indeed time and seasons belong to God. We have two in our neighborhood or village hospitalised. One, a child of eight months who is in the Kenya National Hospital is in better condition after she had a surgery because of a blood clot. She has a bill of 600k or \$4780 (USD) and is still in the hospital. We had today the meeting to help them to meet the bill and look forward for her full recovery.

The second is a lady whose unborn child had died. She was required to have an operation to save her own life.

My wife and children over the period of two weeks have been sick. I think it's because they are schooling in Namanga and they had changed the environment.
