INTRODUCTION

- 1 Corinthians 15 focuses on the necessity Christ's resurrection.
- Paul preaches salvation through resurrection.
- Paul faced the possibility of death whenever he preached **Acts 14:19**.

What Does

“Die Daily”

Mean?

- Form of speech, meaning “continually exposed to death.”
- Dying daily is a practical application of **Luke 9:23**.
- Die to flesh- **Galatians 5:24**; **Galatians 2:20**
Questions: Am I in Christ? Will I Be Found in Christ?
- Die to sin **Romans 6:6**. Old man starts each day. CRUCIFIXION- sentence; gradual (suffering)

Why Should We Want to “Die Daily”?

1) makes us free from sin

Romans 6:7, 11

2) allows us to live unto
righteousness **1 Peter**
2:24.

3) empowers us to face
struggles of life **Acts**
20:24.

- Study of scripture-
2 Timothy 2:15
- Repent when fall- **Acts 3:19**

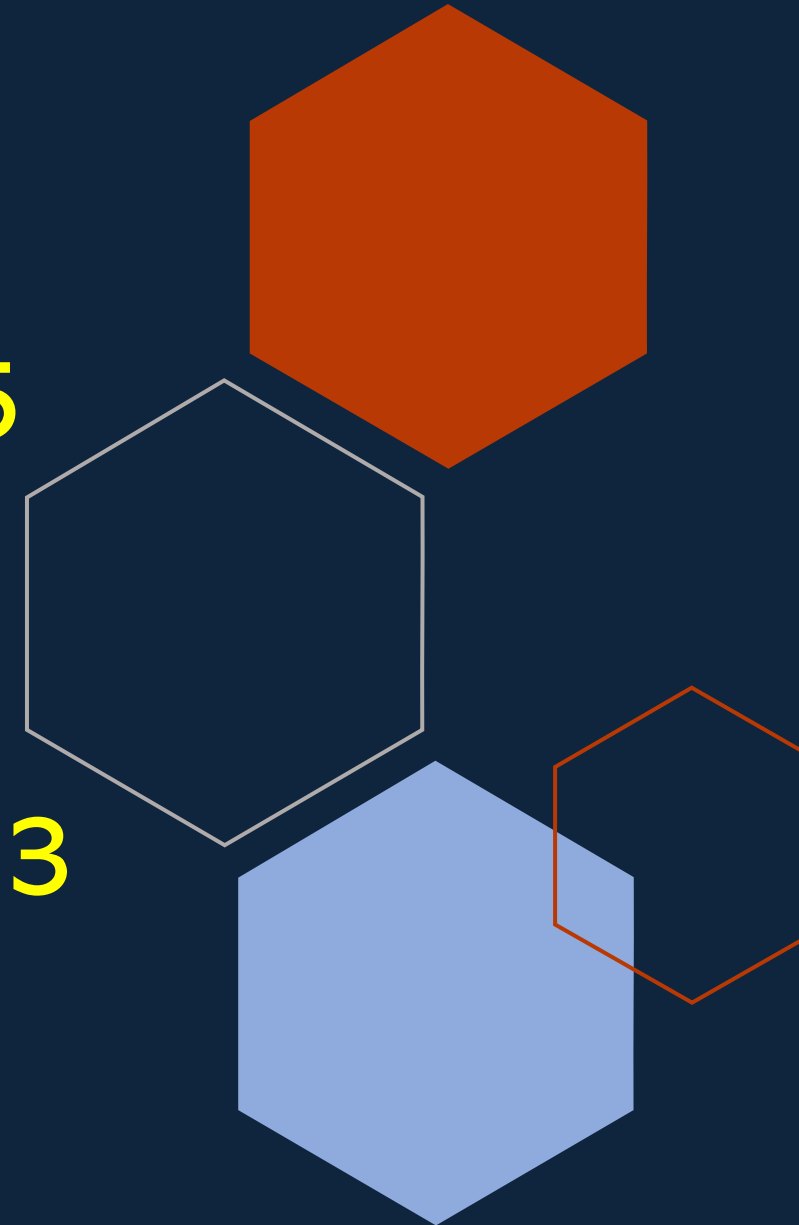


Conclusion
